# Social Events at Hickory Hills

This summer, the LMG is putting together some great community events for Hickory Hills residents. #### **Hickory Hills Lake Glass Bottom Boat**

The boat seen below is the latest tool to help us find Fanwort in our lake. The boat was donated by Sean & Gayle O'Connell & the glass work was donated & completed by Monty Tech!!



#### Fanwort Update

As most of you are all aware, Fanwort, an invasive weed, has been found in our lake. It's an aggressive weed which grows extremely quickly (up to 2" per day).



A patch of over 100 plants has been found off Island Rd (Mulpus Brook area), another large patch was found on the other side of Island Rd, many smaller patches by the Island Rd Beach, and the former Boat Ramp Cove is again infested despite all the hard work that went into eradicating it there.

In order to try and prevent additional spreading, which we MUST control, visual surveys are being done regularly by volunteers so we can identify any spread and take the necessary steps to mitigate it.

We are aggressively recruiting for additional survey volunteers and Suction Harvester team volunteers. If you'd like to help, please let us know.

Areas of suspected Fanwort are being marked. If you see one of these markers (noodle piece pictured below)

in the lake, immediately leave the area and **DO NOT REMOVE THE MARKER!!** 

Fanwort reproduces by fragmentation. Swimming or boating in an area with Fanwort could easily cause the plant to fragment & spread.

If you see fanwort floating on the top of the water, please pick it up. If you see it growing, immediately leave the area and DO NOT TOUCH THE PLANT.




Please call the office before arriving to make sure someone is there, 978-582-6365. If necessary, appointments may be made for a more convenient time. Remember you can always leave payments and

#### **Beach Hours**

The beaches are open from dawn to dusk. Please make sure your vehicles have HHL stickers when parking at the beaches & are not in the parking lot after 8:00 p.m. except for volleyball nights on Thursday's.



#### **Security Team & Contact Number**

This season we have a new Security Team. Please welcome **Randy Gagne** and **Matthew Charpentier**. They are patrolling the lake area and beaches by boat (security boat engine was recalled and at the shop for 2 weeks, but is back in business) during varied hours every day throughout the summer. Please be prepared to show your IDs and have boat stickers visible on all watercrafts, as well as free resident car stickers on your automobile parked at our lots. Your cooperation is appreciated.

If you 1) have a boating safety concern, 2) are wondering if Security is free to inspect your boat outside inspection hours, 3) notice a non-resident at one of our 3 beaches, 4) see a floating dock lost, or 5) see a tree log drifting in the lake, please call our NEW security phone number at (978) 868-6940. If you have an emergency situation call the police directly.

#### **Our Boat Entry Protocol**

In order to prevent further introduction of invasive species into Hickory Hills, we have formalized the way in which boats are put into the lake from the



Island Road boat launch. The BOD has been in contact with most everyone who doesn't use the ramp. It is expected that anyone putting a boat into the lake from private shorelines follow the states regulations and guidelines for invasive species control. Please contact the office with any questions or concerns.

HHL will continue to staff the boat launch to perform boat and trailer inspections prior to allowing boats to be placed into the lake from the boat ramp. Additionally, HHL is working with the local marine dealers, who put a considerable number of boats into the lake, to standardize their processes to minimize the exposure of Hickory Hills to invasive species that come from other area lakes.

Thank you for all your cooperation in this evolving process to maintain the purity and scenic beauty of our wonderful lake.

#### **Registration of Boats and Motors**

All watercrafts and motors must be registered through the office. Boat stickers are \$20.00 for non-shareholders and \$10.00 for shareholders.

Safe Boating Guides are available at the office!

Please contact the office to get your boat or car stickers to park in one of our lots.



#### Safety & Wake Buoy's on Hickory Hills Lake

While the Hazard Red buoys represented in the map below are self explanatory (apologies to our black & white hard copy subscribers), the No Wake buoys deserve a few minutes of our time. First, the generic MA State rules and regulations "The following speed restrictions address operating your boat near a swimming area: It is prohibited to operate within 150 feet of a shoreline that is used as a swimming area. It is prohibited to operate within 75 feet of a float or marker designating a swimming area. It is prohibited to operate your boat at greater than headway speed when operating 150 ft to 300 ft from a shoreline used as a swimming area. For the purpose of these regulations, headway speed is defined as the minimum speed a vessel may be operated to maintain steerage way, not to exceed 6 mph."

Since the ENTIRE shore of HHL is essentially a swim area... at no time should a boat be operated at greater than headway speed within 150 feet of the shore (that is 1/2 of a football field!), ANY SHORE.

Thus, the No Wake locations have been chosen to simply remind boaters of their responsibility in those HIGH TRAFFIC coves for which it is not possible to maintain the required 150 ft distance from shore to motor above 6 mph. As you enter any cove with a No Wake buoy, you must maintain headway speed the ENTIRE time that you are "inside" of the buoy. You may only go to full throttle AFTER passing the buoy in the other direction (e.g. out of the cove), while maintaining 300 ft distance from shore.

**Headway Speed** is the slowest speed at which the motorboat can be operated and maintain steerage, but not to exceed 6 mph. **No Wake** means operating a boat at headway speed as defined above, which means that no "white water" can be seen trailing the boat.

Right of Way — Canoes, kayaks, and sailboats ALWAYS have the right of way on the lake. Motorboats must maintain a distance to prevent the wash from motors splashing or causing excessive rocking of other boats.

These rules governing speed limits and right of way are state law.
